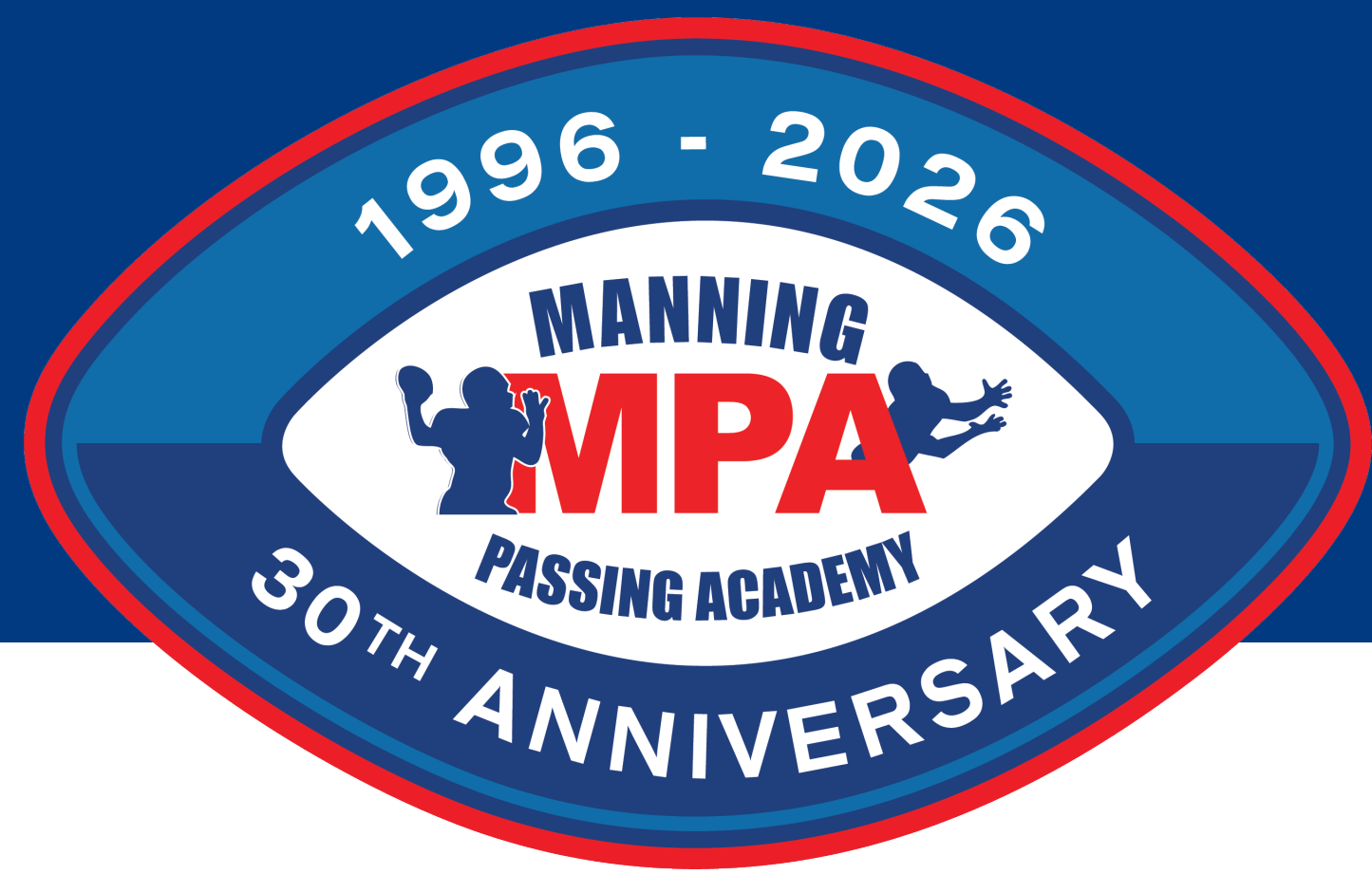

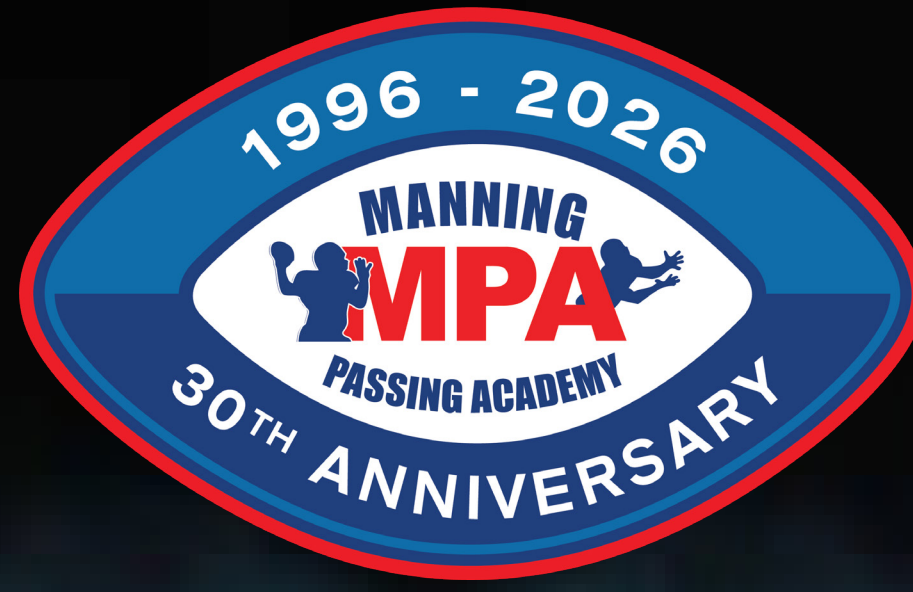

# CAMP REMINDERS



- The best source for info is always our web site: ManningPassingAcademy.com.
- **CAMPERS WHO ARE YOUNGER THAN 8TH GRADE ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO ATTEND.**
- Due to the restrictions of our camp liability insurance, campers must [minimally] be entering grade 8 by the start of camp and cannot have graduated from high school.
- Verify your camper's information on our website's **CONFIRMATION PAGE** and double-check GRADE (as of September 2026), **POSITION** (choose only one).
- Check-in for all campers is from 11am – 4pm on Thursday at **Stophor Gym** (see map). Late arrivals (after 4pm) should report to the Camp Office at **Ellender Hall BEFORE** participating in any camp activities.
- Only Campers are allowed at check-in due to efficiency. Friends and Family will be directed to the **NSU Hospitality** Area set up nearby with refreshments and local points of interest.
- To arrange transportation using the **AIRPORT SHUTTLE link** ... you must go to our website to make reservations (\$40.00 one way or \$80.00 for roundtrip). Both campers and parents are eligible if they make reservations in advance. This service is provided by an outside company.
- Feel free to choose your own roommate in advance but make sure the person agrees. If you don't have someone in mind, we will assign you a camper who is in the same grade as you. No changes are made once the assignments have been set.
- Due to the local Fire Code only two campers are allowed per room. You cannot change rooms on your own.
- Overnight campers will go directly from check-in to their assigned rooms in the Residence Halls to set up their rooms. Adults are not allowed above the lobby floor.
- Day Campers can tour campus and visit the Hospitality Area until they report to **Guidry Stadium** at 5:00pm.
- The first meal will be provided by McDonalds at 5:30pm in the stadium.
- All beds have a **TWIN XL** mattress. Overnight Campers need to bring all their own bedding (i.e. sleeping bags, blankets, sheets, pillows, toiletries, etc.).
- You should **NOT** bring TVs, radios or anything of value to camp.
- Concessions (i.e. Chik-Fil-A or Uber Eats) is available immediately after evening events.
- The **Camp Office phone (985-448-5071)** is for business purposes and emergencies only. Please use personal cell phones to communicate with your camper.
- Day Campers (commuters) are welcome to stay on campus and hang out in the Residence Hall Day Rooms right up until 10pm (before bed check).
- There are showers available for Day Campers in the football locker room, but lockers are not available. Campers must keep their possessions with them.
- Make sure you bring plenty of changes of clothes for the weekend (shorts, T-shirts, socks, etc.).
- ALL Campers should print their names on all the possessions (especially their football and gym bag) and remember to keep your dorm room locked at all times.
- You must have personal primary health insurance to attend this camp. You cannot participate without it. If you have completed the online application, you will have already provided your insurance information and completed a waiver. And remember ... **children who are entering the 7th grade or younger – ARE NOT ELIGIBLE.**
- You do NOT have to have to have a physical to attend this camp (your parents have already signed a waiver).
- If you must cancel understand that the \$100.00 DEPOSIT IS NON-REFUNDABLE (there are no exceptions).
- The MPA will allow for a **one-time "POSTPONEMENT"** (without a financial penalty) to a future camp (if requested BEFORE June 1, 2026). After 6/1 there are no refunds.
- For safety and security, the MPA employs law enforcement officers who are on campus 24 hours a day.

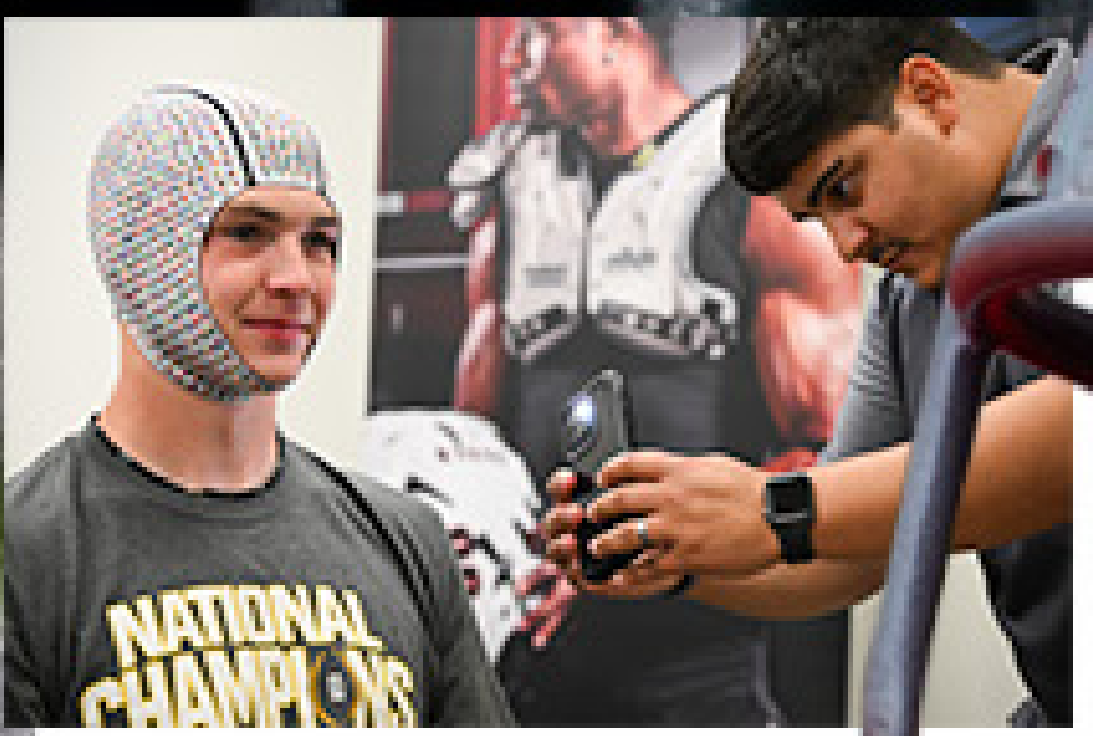

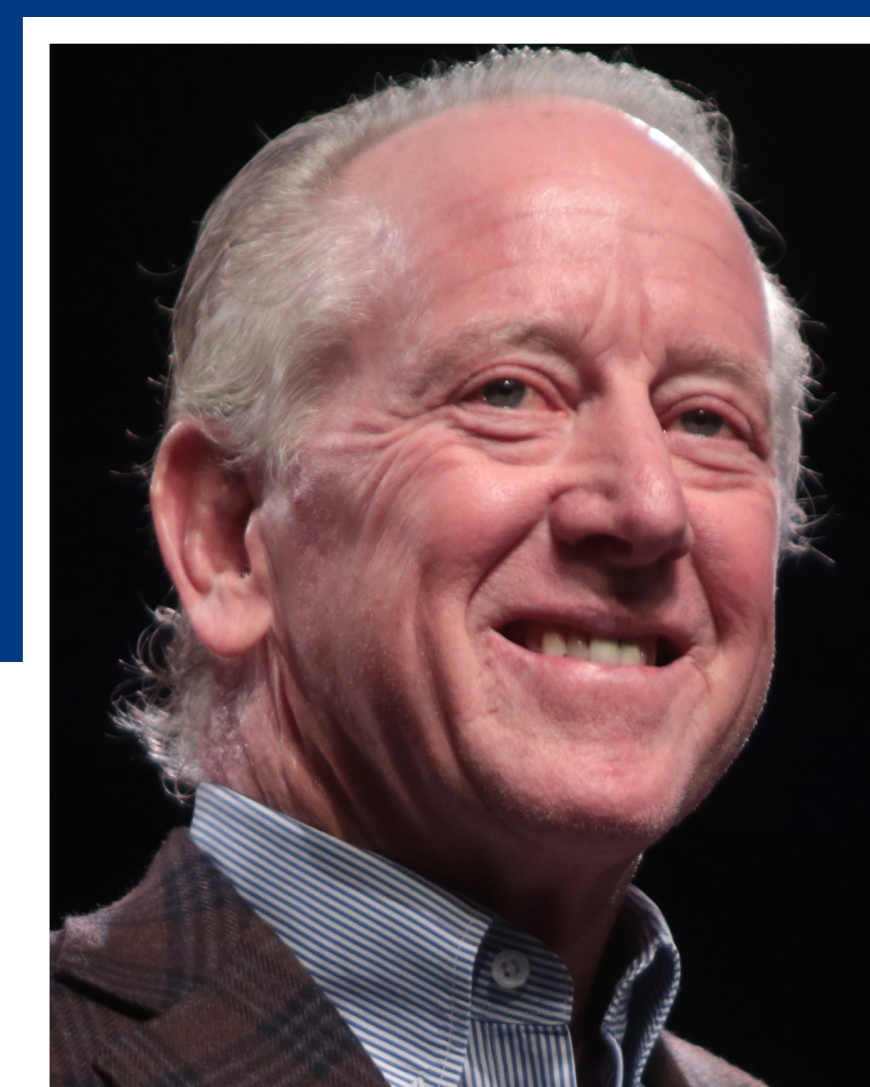

# ARCHIE MANNING

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Archie's leadership, dedication, and commitment have defined his success both on and off the football field. As Executive Director of the Manning Passing Academy, he oversees every aspect of the camp, ensuring excellence in teaching and coaching. His extensive football background embodies the ideals of discipline, perseverance, and teamwork.

## NFL Career

Selected as the second overall pick in the 1971 NFL Draft, Archie enjoyed a 14-year career with the New Orleans Saints, Houston Oilers, and Minnesota Vikings. As the Saints' quarterback, he was named the league's MVP in 1978 and earned two Pro Bowl selections. He is a member of the New Orleans Saints Hall of Fame and its prestigious Ring of Honor.

## College Career

One of the greatest players in Ole Miss history, Archie was the recipient of the Walter Camp Award and earned All-American, All-SEC, and All-South honors. He was named SEC Player of the Year in 1969 and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1989. He is also enshrined in the Ole Miss, Sugar Bowl, and Gator Bowl Halls of Fame.

## Community Leadership

Archie has dedicated himself to philanthropy, supporting numerous charitable organizations in Louisiana and Mississippi. He has been widely recognized for his integrity, leadership, and commitment to giving back. He currently serves as Chairman of the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame and is an active member of the Allstate Sugar Bowl Championship Committee.

In February 2025, Archie and his wife Olivia made a transformational gift to Children's Hospital of New Orleans, and its renaming to the Manning Family Children's Hospital. Their contributions to the community were further recognized when they received the 2024 Heart of a Champion Award from the American Heart Association's Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards. That same year, Archie was honored with the Tuss McClaughry Award, the highest distinction from the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

Over the years, he has received numerous prestigious accolades, including:

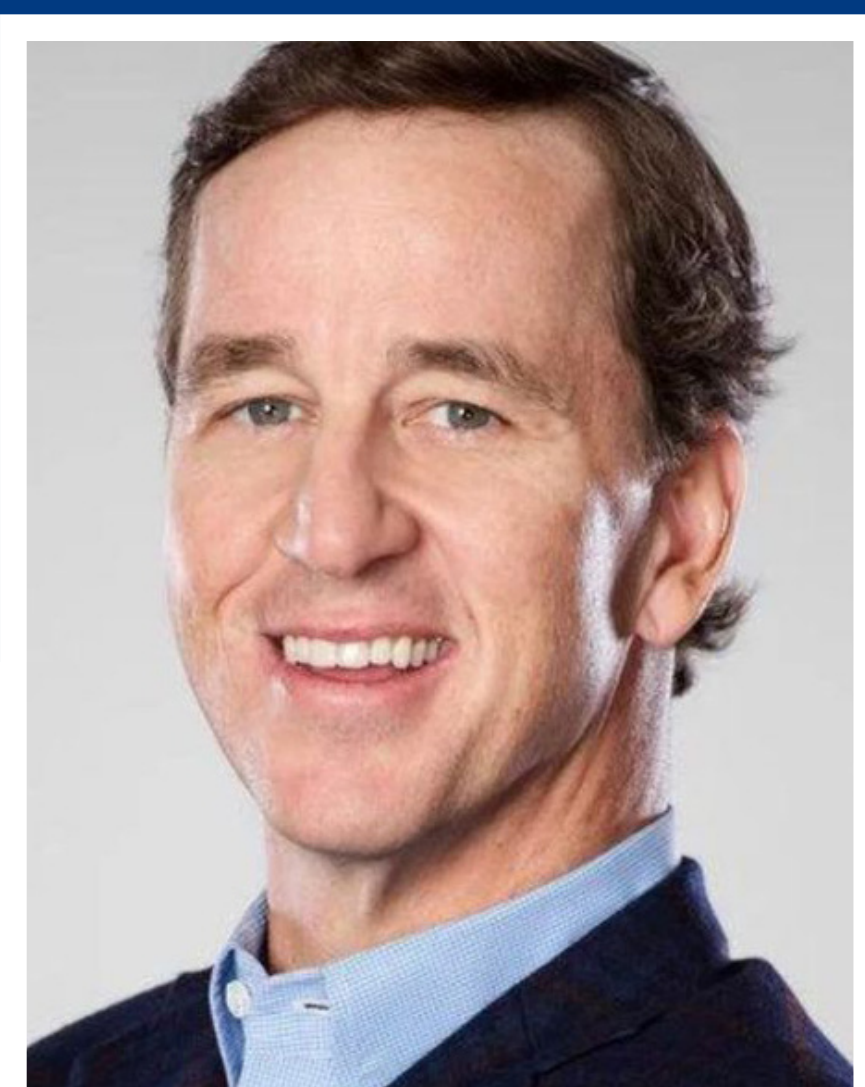

## Community Impact

A portion of the Manning Passing Academy's proceeds is donated to numerous charities. Additionally, the Manning Award, presented by the Sugar Bowl Committee, is the only national quarterback award that factors in postseason performance, honoring Archie, Peyton, and Eli. Also, Archie and Peyton co-authored the book "Manning: A Father, His Sons, and a Football Legacy".

Archie and Olivia reside in New Orleans and are proud grandparents of nine grandchildren from their sons Cooper, Peyton, and Eli.





# COOPER MANNING

SENIOR ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

Cooper, the oldest of the three Manning brothers, has earned national recognition for his humor and wit as host of “The Manning Hour” on Fox NFL Sunday. His experience in high school, college and professional sports has made him a natural fit in the broadcast booth and he has hosted and/or co-hosted numerous projects over the years, including both television and radio shows during football season on WWL in New Orleans.

## College Career

Cooper was heavily recruited by Division I schools, including University of Texas, Virginia, and Ole Miss, before deciding to attend his father’s alma mater (Ole Miss) on a football scholarship. A career-ending injury forced the Rebel receiver to the sidelines, but his love for the game has never diminished.

## High School

He was a two-time All-State wide receiver at Isidore Newman and played in the Louisiana High School All-Star Game as well as played on two state championship basketball teams.

## Business and Community

He is currently a principal at AJ Capital Partners, a vertically integrated real estate development and investment firm. As senior managing director, Cooper focuses on business development and investor relations. In 2014, AJ Capital launched the Graduate hotels brand, a hand-crafted collection of hotels in university-anchored markets across the country, and currently have 35 locations across the U.S. and U.K.

Prior to joining AJ Capital Partners, he worked in institutional equity sales with Howard Weil in New Orleans, specializing in the oil and gas business. During his 16 years at Howard Weil, he was integral in positing the company as a leader in the energy sector. He was involved in the sale of Howard Weil to Scotia Bank in 2012 and remained on through the transition as a partner.

Cooper is a board member at The Idea Village and is actively involved with The Academy of Sacred Heart, his alma mater Isidore Newman School and the Manning Family Children’s Hospital in New Orleans.

A University of Mississippi graduate, He lives in New Orleans with his wife and three children.

# PEYTON MANNING

SENIOR ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR



After an 18-year NFL career that included being the first person selected in the 1998 NFL Draft, two Super Bowl victories, five MVP awards, and a first-ballot Hall of Fame induction. Along with his enshrinement into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, he is also enshrined in the Louisiana, Tennessee, Indiana, Colorado and the UT Athletics Sports Halls of Fame.

Peyton continues to influence the game. His relentless preparation and leadership now extend beyond the field, shaping young athletes, engaging in philanthropy, and pioneering new projects in sports media.

## Post-NFL Career & Media

Peyton founded Omaha Productions, a media company producing award-winning sports content, including “Peyton’s Places” on ESPN+. He also co-hosts the Emmy-winning “ManningCast” on ESPN’s Monday Night Football with his brother Eli.

The two have also teamed up and served as head coaches for the first three years of “The Pro Bowl Games”, adding new energy and a revamp to the annual NFL post-season event.

## NFL Career

Regarded as one of the greatest quarterbacks in NFL history, Peyton set numerous league records and led both the Indianapolis Colts and Denver Broncos to Super Bowl victories. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame (2021) as a first-ballot selection.

The Colts retired his No. 18 jersey in 2017 and honored him with a statue at Lucas Oil Stadium. In 2021, he was unanimously elected as the 35th member of the Denver Broncos Ring of Fame.

## Collegiate Career

A College Football Hall of Fame inductee (2017), Peyton set 42 NCAA, SEC, and Tennessee records, winning the Davey O’Brien, Maxwell and the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award in 1997. His No. 16 jersey was retired by Tennessee.

## High School

He attended Isidore Newman High School in New Orleans and was an All-American, All-State and All-District pick at QB. He was selected the Gatorade Circle of Champions National Player of the Year.

## Community Impact

Through his PeyBack Foundation, Peyton has supported at-risk youth programs. He also founded Peyton Manning Children’s Hospital at St. Vincent and has been honored for his philanthropy with awards such as the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year and the Bart Starr Award.

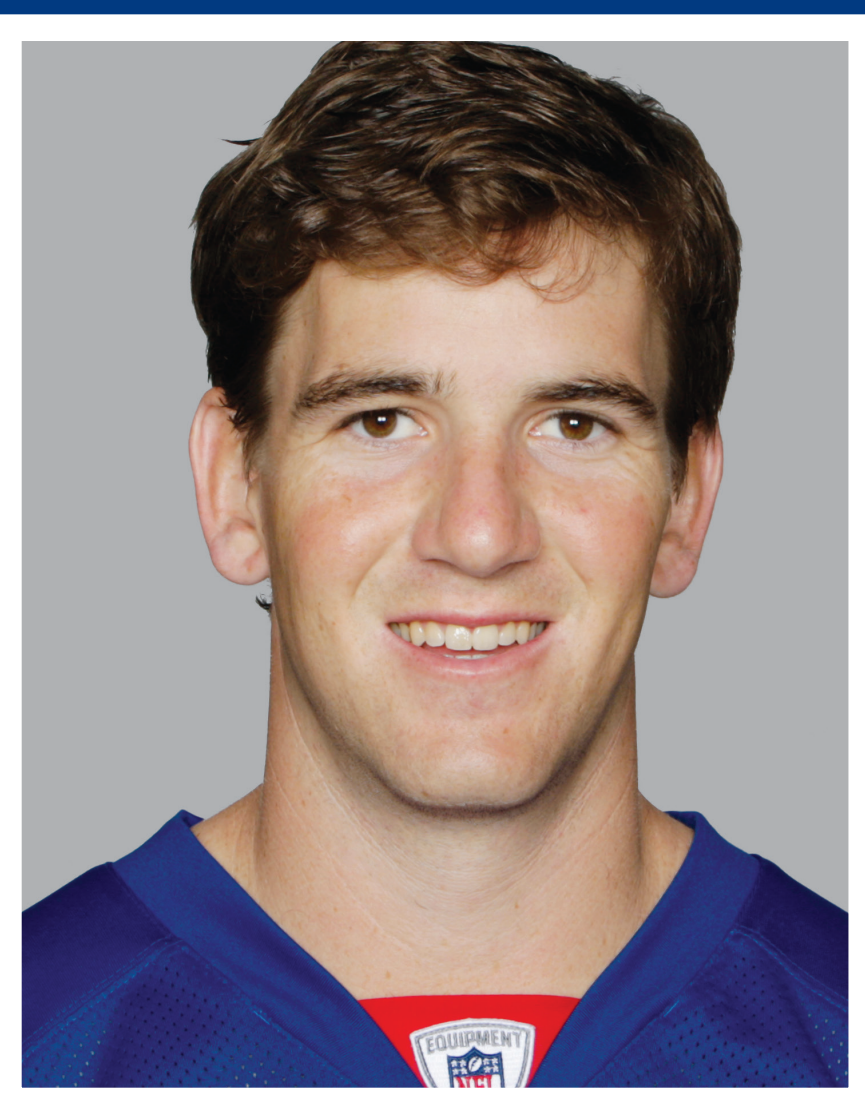

# ELI MANNING

## SENIOR ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

Eli's 16-year NFL career set the standard for quarterback excellence. The first overall pick in the 2004 NFL Draft, he became a two-time Super Bowl champion, two-time Super Bowl MVP, and Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year recipient. He is widely regarded as the most accomplished quarterback in New York Giants history. Known for his durability, he once held an ironman streak of 210 consecutive starts, ranking among the longest by a quarterback in league history.

### Post-Retirement & Broadcasting

Eli remains active in football media, hosting Eli's Places, a college football documentary series on ESPN+, and co-hosting Monday Night Football with Peyton & Eli (The ManningCast) on ESPN, which won Sports Emmy Awards for Outstanding Live Series in 2022 and 2024.

The two have also teamed up and served as head coaches for the first three years of "The Pro Bowl Games", adding new energy and a revamp to the annual NFL post-season event.

In 2024, he was inducted into the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame, and in 2023, he was honored with jersey retirements by both the New York Giants and Ole Miss. That same year, he was also inducted into the Cotton Bowl Classic Hall of Fame and the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame.

### NFL Career

Eli retired on January 22, 2020, and in September 2021, the Giants honored him with a Ring of Honor induction and jersey retirement. He ranks in the Top 10 in NFL history for completions, pass attempts, passing yards, and passing touchdowns, and his 234 career starts are the fourth-most by a quarterback for a single franchise.

A four-time Pro Bowler, Eli led the Giants to two Super Bowl victories (XLII, XLVI) and was named Super Bowl MVP in both games, making him one of only five players to win multiple Super Bowl MVP awards. He was recognized by the Giants by having his No. 10 jersey retired and his name added to the Giants Ring of Honor.

In 2011, Eli threw for a career-high 4,933 yards and recorded 14 consecutive 3,000-yard seasons—the first Giants quarterback to do so.

For his impact both on and off the field, he received the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year Award (2016) and the Bart Starr Award (2020), recognizing outstanding character and leadership.

### College Career

Eli set 45 passing records at Ole Miss and in his senior season he led the Rebels to a 10-3 record and a Cotton Bowl victory, earning the Maxwell Award (Nation's Top Player), Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (Top Senior QB), Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, SEC Player of the Year and the Conerly Trophy (Best Player in Mississippi).

### High School

Eli attended Isidore Newman School in New Orleans, earning All-American, All-State, and All-District honors at quarterback.

### Community Impact

Eli has raised millions for The Eli Manning Children's Clinics at the University of Mississippi Medical Center and supports March of Dimes and Guiding Eyes for the Blind among other philanthropic areas.

Eli and his wife, Abby, live in New Jersey with their four children: Ava, Lucy, Caroline, and Charles "Charlie" Elisha.

Thibodaux Regional Sports Medicine Center is the official hospital and sports medicine provider of the Manning Passing Academy. Athletic trainers are present at all on-field events, and are on 24-hour call for the duration of camp to manage medical issues. Sports Medicine Trained Orthopedists and Primary Care Physicians are also available if additional care is needed.

In the event of a medical emergency, Thibodaux Regional's close proximity to the camp allows for quick response and expedited treatment. Heat illness is of primary concern in southeast Louisiana. The Sports Medicine Center staff is well trained in recognizing the signs and symptoms of such conditions. Hydration is a top priority in an effort to keep campers well and performing at their best.

### **MPA 30TH ANNIVERSARY**

The Manning Passing Academy is owned and operated by the first family of football; Archie, Cooper, Peyton and Eli Manning... and is an integral part of their lives. The Manning's are always the first to arrive and the last to leave. The concept of this camp sprang from the concern that even the most basic fundamental skills of throwing and catching a football were lacking during a youngster's developmental years (grades 8 - 12). It was this concern that motivated the Manning's to bring together some of the most successful and brightest coaches and players from the professional, college, and high school ranks each summer in Louisiana. And although the Manning name has been practically synonymous with the quarterback position for almost 60 years ... it's not just for QBs.

### **EQUIPMENT**

This is a non-contact football camp and therefore NO football equipment is required, but there are minimal needs. Campers should bring both grass-cleated shoes and a pair of sneakers in case of inclement weather. Although Nike is providing a football to all campers this year, all campers are encouraged to bring their own football that fits their hand. And make sure you print your name on the ball. They all look alike. Mouthpieces are always recommended and encouraged. All campers should bring a minimum of a three-times-daily change of socks, shorts and T-shirts. Our sponsors will provide each camper gifts that include a gym bag, two T-shirts, a pair of shorts, a key lanyard, a water bottle, and more.

### **CHECK-IN PROCESS**

Check-in is between 11am and 4pm on Thursday at Stopher Gymnasium located on the campus of Nicholls State University in Thibodaux, La. If you arrive late you should report directly to the Camp Office at Ellender Hall.

### **ROOMMATES**

Rooming assignments will be made prior to camp. Campers must request roommate preferences ahead of camp. Only two campers per room due to code. No changes will be accommodated once room assignments have been made.

### **CHECK-OUT PROCESS**

Checkout will commence immediately after the morning practice on Sunday between 11am – Noon. Overnight Campers must turn their keys in at their respective dorms. Lost keys have a replacement cost of \$50 each. Day Campers checkout at Guidry Stadium.

### **AIRPORT SHUTTLE**

The AIRPORT SHUTTLE service is available for those campers and parents flying in and out of New Orleans International Airport (also known as Louis Armstrong Airport/ MSY). Fare is \$40 each way or \$80 for round trip service. The service is offered by an outside company and is only available on the first day of camp (Thursday between 10am – 3pm) and the last day of camp (Sunday between 12pm -2pm). First come first depart. Forms are available to make reservations on the web site under AIRPORT SHUTTLE. They do not allow walk-ups. A reservation form is available on our web site [www.manningpassingacademy.com](http://www.manningpassingacademy.com) (see SHUTTLE in the menu) to secure your spot. You can scan and email or fax (541-225-5146) the form to the camp office with flight and payment information (credit card only). Payment and reservations must be made in advance, space is limited. A cancellation fee of \$10 will apply.

When campers arrive at the New Orleans Airport on Thursday, they will be met by an MPA staff member in the luggage area and they will direct them to the Hilton Airport Shuttle which will take them across the street to the Hilton. The campers will be able to relax while they wait for their shuttle's departure. Shuttles typically run on the hour starting at 11am. Shuttles will drop off directly at the camp registration area (Stopher Gym) at Nicholls State University. On the return trip on Sunday, campers will depart campus beginning about 12 Noon and will be dropped off directly at their respective airline at the New Orleans International Airport. The last shuttle departs Camp (Ellender Hall) at 2pm.
